Pitt's medical school "Class Play" has become a unique entity worldwide, and we owe it all to the steadfast support of Pittsburgh's medical community. With this continued enthusiastic support, the show can only increase in Scope.

RICHARD W. ("DICK") MORIARTY, M.D.





ABOUT THE TITLE . . .

The tiny word "SMEGMA"—what does it mean? World-famous linguist Willard Funk ranked it out "among the 10 most powerful words with which I have come in contact." Noted etymologist Hubert Fruhmundechaes evidently disagreed, for he called it "one of my most vexing problems; it simply refuses to go away."

While its roots are lost, of course, in antiquity, most scholars agree that the construct "SMEGMAE" is of "il graeco non gotta paterfamilias," or Bastardized Greek. It seems early on to have been a medical term. and while legitimacy cannot be separated from legend, many trace the first such usage to Hippocrates. One ancient artifact records what is apparently an account of an "intercoursenon contranaturel"-a typical Hippocratean teaching discourse with his students. It contains numerous references to the word, which seemed to mean literally "a healing substance or poultice" (as in: "and the physician is exigent in the need. to cleanse his hands of the SMEGMAE before proceeding with the incision of the entrails"), and figuratively, "healing; to heal; applying the health art" (as in: "hold most dear the principle that there can be no higher honour than the sharing of one's SMEGMAE with one's fellowgreek"). During the Hippocratean period, the word was in such common usage as to have been incorporated into some versions of the Middle Greek alphabet (as in: "Alpha, Betta, Gamma, Smegma . . . ")!

Through the ages, the word remained entrenched in the medical jargon, and while specific meanings and usages have varied, the spirit of its original definition endures. It is in this solemn spirit that the tradition of using a humorous or satiric title for the yearly Scope & Scalpel Production has been abandoned in favor of the classical allusion, "SMEGMA HOUSE." Its most recent usage? The U.S. Patent Office lists Application #61370447-Z79 for "SMEGMA RECIPE," filed 2-31-79 by R. W. Moriarty, "described by Applicant(s) as the Universal Antidote for Child and Adolescent Poisonings, please do not induce vomiting."
