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INTRODUCTION.

How strange it is that people are so negligent about their teeth! Indeed, thousands seem hardly to think about them, except when they are troubled with the toothache. Most individuals seldom consider their importance, either as regards their usefulness or beauty, until they have been lost, or become irreparably decayed. It is certainly astonishing to notice the *profound ignorance* upon this subject. Ask every member of your family, or all your neighbors, the simple question as to the number of teeth nature has given them, and the chance is ten to one they cannot correctly inform you. The truth is, there is not one in a hundred who can give an accurate answer, either as to the composition of the teeth, or whether they are decayed and suffering to be filled, or perfectly sound. The Almanac contains familiar and practical information, which will be found useful and instructive.

NUMBER AND COMPOSITION OF THE TEETH.

THEN the first set, nature furnishes only twenty teeth; but in an adult, or second set, thirty-two teeth. Sometimes they vary a little, but this is, in most cases, the correct number.

The teeth are composed of particles of lime held in contact by animal glue. Over the bony or inorganic part of the tooth there is a delicate layer of enamel, which is the hardest substance in the human body. It covers the upper part or crown of the teeth, and is very necessary for their protection, not only when eating, but from acids, which would destroy them were it not for this covering. It is also very hard; you can strike fire with it against a bit of steel, and when buried in the earth it will remain unchanged for centuries. When this beautiful and necessary covering is removed, the teeth soon become sensitive and decay. It is very essential that it should *never be injured*.

I have frequently noticed instances where people have gone to ignorant and inexperienced operators and had their teeth cleaned or "scraped," and

they have been sadly hurt and irreparably injured. Be careful, then, about preserving this enamel of your teeth, and never have them cleansed unless they need it, and then allow none but a careful and competent operator to do it. Be sure also not to mutilate the enamel by cracking nuts or biting very hard substances, for you know not what pain and suffering you may experience from it.

BRUSHING THE TEETH.

T is very prevalent for people to "let the teeth go," and not put a brush into their mouths, unless they are going to church, to a party, or to a wedding, because, as they say, "they have not time." They rise in the morning, wash their face, adjust the hair, and forget all about the teeth! They are not thought of! When the fact is, *the teeth require the use of water more than the face.* Every time you masticate your food, a small portion of it will adhere to the teeth, and if suffered to remain, forms gradually into tartar, and owing to its power, imperceptibly consumes the gum and destroys the sockets into which nature has inserted them, and then the teeth come out perfectly sound.

Among the Mussulmen, it was considered a *religious precept* to rinse the mouth thrice and to clean the teeth with a brush. If the reader has been negligent in times past, let me urge the adoption of the brush and the use of cold water, at least once a day, for these reasons :—

1st. The teeth, in order to be preserved, should be clean, and they cannot, of course, be in a wholesome condition, unless they are free from all excrescence, which the brush alone will remove.

2d. If you do not brush your teeth, your breath will become badly tainted, and the regard you have for the comfort of your friends alone, should be enough to induce you to keep them in a healthy state.

3d. The tartar which collects upon the teeth, is not only an offence and a most positive mark of vice, but the direct cause of pulmonary complaints, and in some instances the occasion of death.

Could the reader but see the situation of mouths into which I am frequently obliged to look, could they but behold this incrustation of tartar on the inside and outside of the teeth, they would not another day allow their masticating apparatus to be neglected. It

is not impossible but that the tartar upon your teeth has become so hard and firm that the brush will make no impression upon it;—should that be the case, and there be a dark substance close to the gum, it should be thoroughly and immediately removed, and then the brush can be used to good purpose.

FILLING TEETH.



MOST important matter is to retain the natural teeth, *because they are better than artificial ones.*

One cause of the cariousness of the natural teeth is the collection of particles of food between the teeth, or in their natural crevices, where they putrify, and by the aid of acids produce decay. If the disease is taken in season, and the carious portion of the tooth removed, it can be filled so as to be serviceable for life. The upper teeth are rather more apt to decay than the under ones, and I attribute it to the fact, that the saliva in the mouth washes the under teeth, so that they are usually retained much longer than the upper ones.

We often see persons with the front teeth nearly all gone; and how unpleasantly it strikes the mind! It in-

ARTIFICIAL TEETH.

TO every one it must be obvious, that nothing attracts the eye so quickly, or so readily creates unpleasant feelings in the minds of others, as the absence of teeth. The loss of them is a great misfortune; because, without them a person cannot masticate his food — the face becomes disfigured — and the voice is rendered very indistinct. Depend upon it, you cannot find an individual who is destitute of teeth that can speak distinctly. The tones of the voice and articulation are always vague and broken. Then again, the food cannot be masticated, but must enter the stomach in the same condition as when placed in the mouth, thus giving the digestive organs of the stomach a double duty to perform, which is more than nature ever intended; and the result is, the functions of the stomach become, sooner or later, irreparably injured and destroyed.

Then, too, in a toothless person, you will notice the great projection and elongation of the chin — the wrinkles upon, and the falling in of the lips — and especially when eating, the singular approximation of the chin and nose, which seem to imitate the action of the bellows when in use, exhibiting the

greatest deformity to which we are subjected.



These evils which have been named, will at once be understood by those who have *lost one or more of the front teeth*. It is not necessary for me to describe the difficulty of speech, or the attendant mortification to the unfortunate sufferer. All who have been, or are afflicted by the loss of the front teeth, fully understand the misfortune attendant upon it.

We daily see people who have lost their front teeth, and who seem to be so indifferent about their looks that they do not resort to those great blessings, *artificial teeth*. They neglect it day after day, till they become accus-

tomed to the condition of their mouths, and then, disregarding the opinions of others, they go without them. Such a course is not right — we should pay some deference to the taste and feelings of others. Suppose, for instance, you entered a store and found the shop-keeper destitute of teeth! What do you think the effect would be? Would he be successful in disposing of his goods to you? Certainly not! You would at once have a prejudice against him, though you might not at the time think of the *cause* of your dislike. The more *he urged* you to purchase, the more decided would you be not to patronize him. We are all more or less influenced by the good looks of others; and those who effect the largest sales, either in our stores or confectionary shops, are those who have handsome teeth and a corresponding face.

It is gratifying to know that the *loss of the teeth can be supplied*. There is now no cause of complaint. Where persons are destitute of one or more teeth, they can have artificial ones substituted, so that the misfortune is not at all inconvenient. Or where the whole of the upper teeth are gone, — or indeed when the person has not a single tooth, a complete set, upper and under, can be inserted, which will vie

with nature's, and no one can distinguish the difference.

EXTRACTING TEETH.



I think there is not any particular pleasure in having teeth extracted, though compared with the toothache, it is an enjoyment. There are many who have the pain arising from defective teeth, who seem determined not to have them extracted at any rate, although the teeth are not only carious, but ulcerated; — and from the manner in which they will bear the pain, you would suppose they had not only the patience, but actually were even some connection of Job. It is, as a general thing, a bad course to pursue. If you have a tooth that is greatly decayed, is quite sore, producing a swollen face, and which, on retiring to rest, commences with a dull and heavy pain, (always aching more nights than any other time,) you had better have it extracted at once. The reason is this: an abscess may form on the fangs of the tooth, and discharge through the cheek, and thus leave a scar which will disfigure you for life.

Although many hesitate a long time

before they consent to have a tooth removed, yet there are some who allow their teeth to be removed *too soon*. If you have defective teeth, always have them saved by filling, if possible. Still, if the aching grinder *must be removed*, you should select a dentist who possesses proper instruments, and be sure and have it done by daylight.

When extracting the teeth of children, I always make the operation as short as possible; indeed, I have removed four or five of the temporary teeth so quickly that the patient has had no time to make complaints. I never put them in my operating chair, but give them a common seat, for the less parade and the less they see, the better.

If these pages should fall into the hands of parents, let me urge upon them not to deceive their children when they go with them to the dentist. I have been astonished to hear parents talk to their children in order to induce them to submit to an operation; for as the child naturally relies with implicit confidence upon the integrity of the parent, is that parent doing right when he states a deliberate untruth? From the first of my practice to the present time, I have never deceived a child, nor do I ever intend to do it. And I have been

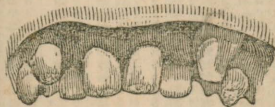

struck with the great difficulty which parents have had, after *once deceiving* a child, to get them to have a second tooth extracted. Duplicity may accomplish in one instance, but it will fail in a thousand.

IRREGULAR TEETH.

PARENTS cannot be too particular in examining the condition of their children's teeth; for if the first set be not removed in season, the new teeth must of necessity crowd themselves inside or outside of the temporary ones.



The deformity of the teeth, produced by parental inattention and neglect, is shown for the purpose of impressing upon the minds of parents a duty which they have heretofore overlooked. The dentist should be often consulted. A large number of families regularly visit my office for this important object.
